1. Mike mentioned right off the bat that he and his wife have lived in worked in nearly 70 war and disaster zones around the world. How does that make you feel? Does that make you wonder am I doing enough? Thoughts?  
If you are re-read Rom 8.1
2. There they stand the ruins of St Andrews Castle off the coast of the North Shores of Scotland. Below the castle you will find carved out of solid Rock the infamous bottle dungeon. This was the notorious prison that housed the scoundrels and villains of the time there they waited in a dark, the villains of St. Andrew. Rarely was someone set free and legend had it that no one escaped the dungeon of St Andrews without the help of someone from the outside. As a Christ follower can you identify with this short story? Thoughts?
3. Read Psalm Chapter 40. When you read this Psalm how does the Psalmist encourage us?
4. Pastor Mike encourages us seek out people lost, in a sea of hopelessness and introduce them to the rescuer. Share a moment where you did witness to someone and Jesus changed their life? Or if you haven't what are some things keeping you from telling your story? The story of how Jesus change your life? We all have a story, be encouraged to share it when the opportunities present itself.
5. After listening to this message how has your view of current events or refugees changed?
6. Pastor Mike mentioned he has seen unspeakable horror, and is often amazed the unspeakable creativity of those under demonic influences. As a result, he is often asked why do you keep going? What does he say helps us each to keep going?
7. He challenges us to look at the suffering around us not thru the eyes of the tainted news coverage but thru the eyes of faith, to look at them thru the eyes of Christ Himself. What does that look like? What are some everyday things that we can do to choose no longer to turn a blind eye to those in need?

8. There are 68,000,000 refugees, which would be the 26<sup>th</sup> largest country in the world? They all have these things in common being afraid, desperate and have no place to go and they are rarely Welcomed. Whom did Pastor Mike identify in the Bible as a refugee? How did that make you feel?
9. What do refugees want?
10. The Refugee Crisis is worse now than it has ever been in recording history. Syria is the single biggest driver of displaced people (refugees). Today the Valley of tears is home to over 400,000 broken, traumatized, cold and very hungry people seeking shelter. Refugees are not terrorists they are the ones fleeing terror! What was your view of refugees before this message?
11. Syrian children are not just hungry for food; what else are they hungry for?
12. What are your thoughts when you here about the little girl who just witnessed unspeakable horror toward her family, when she says Mike I met Jesus, He rescued me, He loves me, He is my friend, I am an orphan but He is my Father and I just learned the other day that Jesus wipes away every tear! Thoughts?
13. What does Mike challenge all Christian all over the world? What was the One danger we need to be careful not to fall into?
14. What is God's heart toward refugees?
